The following report is a supplement to the annual report and includes the activities of Partners for Prosperity (P4P) from March 1 to March 15, 2005 as well as all documents, reports, summaries and memos specified in the annual report. In addition to the supplement we also submit “Attachment C”, which lists Year 2 measurable outcomes as well as ten year measurable outcomes. The ten year outcomes are based on the requirement of the Northwest Area Foundation (NWAFF) that P4P. . .“Prepare a set of measurable outcomes for the balance of strategies as established in the P4P plan to cover the 10 year partnership period”. Therefore all strategies established in the P4P plan include 10 year strategies. It should be noted that the strategic plan calls for a phased approach to poverty reduction. As such the strategies in the plan are not inclusive of Phase 2 strategies which will be developed in Years 2 and 3.

The following is a table of documents included in this supplement. These documents illustrate the progress of implementation, lessons learned, and current work of P4P. In most cases these documents provide a more in depth explanation of outcomes in Attachment B and how the outcomes were achieved.

Pending Outcomes Update as of March 15, 2005

In addition to the documents, there are several updates to report regarding the pending outcomes.

In the annual report the outcomes in Attachment B were categorized as: Complete (88%); Pending (7%); and Changed (5%). Therefore, of the remaining outcomes (not changed), P4P completed 94% as of March 15, 2005. The following table has been updated to reflect the changes in status.

		television studio/station. Several things have already been filmed and the video will be complete by July 1.
Media and public awareness campaign developed	July 1 2005	The PR and Marketing Subcommittee of the P4P Board will meet in April and May to develop this campaign. In addition, we are hiring a graduate intern to assist.
Regional service projects on website	April 1, 2005	The Web Master was hired February 28; target date for web update is April 1.
Develop Service Learning project	July 1, 2005	Staff is currently working on a service learning project with area universities. Final details will be complete by July 1, 2005.

Summary

P4P continues to be a learning and adapting organization that is responsive to new information. All of the pending outcomes are on track for completion and reflect changing circumstances and new information. The strategic plan continues to be a living, breathing document which is reflected in Attachment C Year 2 measurable outcomes and well as the ten year measurable outcomes. P4P will begin Phase 2 in Year 3 of implementation. New strategies, objectives and outcomes will be formulated using the grass roots approach developed during the initial strategic planning phase. The regional community remains committed to increasing prosperity for Eastern Idaho.
