**Re:** Prosperity Preservation Working Group Attachment C Outcomes

1. The leadership and mentoring committee will develop leadership programs that equip people in the lowest economic quartile to participate more effectively as leaders in community problem solving and neighborhood development.
  - a. Identified 2 models of leadership training for the LEQ
    - i. Leadership Plenty, a Pew Charitable Trust program with no cost to participants
    - ii. Evolve in Teton county
  - b. Implemented pilot leadership program (Leadership Plenty) serving 10 people.
2. The Leadership and Mentoring Committee will develop mentorship programs that nurture the success of people in the lowest economic quartile as leaders in community development and poverty reduction measures.
  - a. Identified 5 regional assets for mentorship program.
    - i. Real Choices in Bonneville county
    - ii. Oneida Coalition about Youth
    - iii. PTA and PTO in each school (officer programs)
    - iv. Silver Sage Girl Scouts and Grand Teton Boy Scouts (leader programs)
    - v. EICAP and SEICCA programs
  - b. Identified 2 mentorship models for LEQ
    - i. Toastmasters – Jack C. High toastmasters will mentor a bilingual club in Blackfoot
    - ii. Chambers of Commerce Leadership in Rexburg, Pocatello, Idaho Falls
