Partners for Prosperity was formed in response to an invitation from the Northwest Area Foundation to define poverty in Eastern Idaho and develop a ten-year strategic plan to reduce it. Our strategic plan is based on regional inclusiveness and community involvement. Each of the strategies have been developed with the goal of reducing poverty at the community level, while simultaneously benefiting the Eastern Idaho region as a whole.

Partners for Prosperity facilitates a Regional Prosperity Task Force, made up of citizens across the region who are interested in creating systemic change. In addition, regional Working Groups actively address poverty indicators and form working plans in response to the critical poverty-related issues of Eastern Idaho.
